Alcohol has a staggering burden on South Australia's health system.

Each year alcohol is responsible for more than 400 deaths and 10,500 hospitalisations in South Australia (SA).

We cannot continue to allow alcohol to devastate SA communities.

						
Introduce mandating alcohol pregnancy warning labels on all alcohol products and point of sale material by 2019.						
Introduce the mandatory collection of alcohol sales data in South Australia.						
Introduce a minimum floor price for alcohol in South Australia to address the harm caused by cheap alcohol.
